Almost all classes in both our **Annual Shows** are OPEN to everybody of any age. The Spring Show has a range of classes in flowers, floral art, cookery & preserves, photography, and handicraft. In addition, the Summer Show also offers classes in fruit and vegetables.

The shows are held in the Community Centre, Sheepsetting Lane, Heathfield, TN21 0XG. A schedule for each show is available a few weeks before the event at our meetings, from local nurseries and from local retail outlets.

Members are entitled to **enter 4 classes** in each show **FREE OF CHARGE.** Every other class entry costs 20p in both the Spring Show and the Summer Show.

Class Entry forms must be submitted even if no class entry fees are payable. Entry forms, together with any fees, must be returned to the Show Secretary, or delivered to Heathfield Ironmongers, no later than the Wednesday before the day of the show.

Those judged 1st, 2nd or 3rd in each class win money prizes. Trophies are awarded in accordance with the show schedules and are normally held for a period of one year.

Every adult who views the exhibits at both shows may donate on the door to enter but under 16's get in free.

A *"pop-up cafe"* sells coffee, tea, squash, and a range of home-made cakes, may be at both shows.

The Society's plant stall is just inside the main entrance.

Evening Meetings are held in the main hall of the Community Centre, Sheepsetting Lane, Heathfield, TN21 0XG on the 3rd Monday of the month at 7.30pm [Doors open at 7pm]. Visitors are always made welcome for an entrance fee of £3.00.

The annual programme usually comprises: seven talks; a plant swap and advice evening in May; a private tour of a local garden in June; and social evenings in July and December.

Open Gardens are sociable events where Members invite fellow Members and friends to look around their garden and enjoy a chat over a cup of tea or coffee or a glass of squash and a slice of delicious home-made cake.

A payment of £5.00 gives access to the garden, free refreshments, and a free ticket in the lucky number draw. A second cup or glass is always available, free of charge. Another slice of cake is normally available for a small donation.

One half of the money raised at each event, including proceeds of the plant stall, goes to a good cause chosen by those who kindly open their garden to fellow Members and friends.

An **H D H S Stall** sells surplus plants, garden sundries, produce and second-hand books at most events. The Society organises a **Raffle** at many events. All the proceeds from both activities normally go to Society funds.

October:	hedgerow arrangement
November:	cactus or succulent
December:	Christmas arrangement
